ENROLLMENT

SOUTH CAROLINA DISTRICTS

In the 2019-20 school year there were 81 public school districts in South Carolina. The size of the districts varies greatly from just under 600 students in the Barnwell 19 school district to nearly 77,000 students in Greenville County Schools, the 44th largest school district in the country. About half of the school districts in the state have enrollments of less than 5,000 students including eight school districts with enrollments below 1,000. At the other end of the spectrum, seven school districts have more than 25,000 students. See Table 1 for a listing of all 81 school districts in order by size.

Measuring Enrollment

InformEdsc uses the “135-day active student headcount” as produced by the South Carolina Department of Education. This is the number of students that were actively enrolled on the 135th day of school. Student headcounts are also taken on the 45th and 180th days of the school year.

ENROLLMENT CHARTER SCHOOLS

Greenville County Charter Schools

Charter schools are public schools and operate under a contract with an authorizing agency, which in South Carolina can be a local public school district, the South Carolina Public Charter School District (SCPCSD) or a public or independent institution of higher learning such as the Charter Institute at Erskine. Charter schools in South Carolina must be non-religious, non-homebased and non-profit corporations and can encompass both “brick and mortar” and virtual schools. As with other public schools, charter schools receive both state and federal funds for operations. Charters under a local school district also receive local funds for operations. Those not chartered by a school district receive higher per pupil funding from the state.

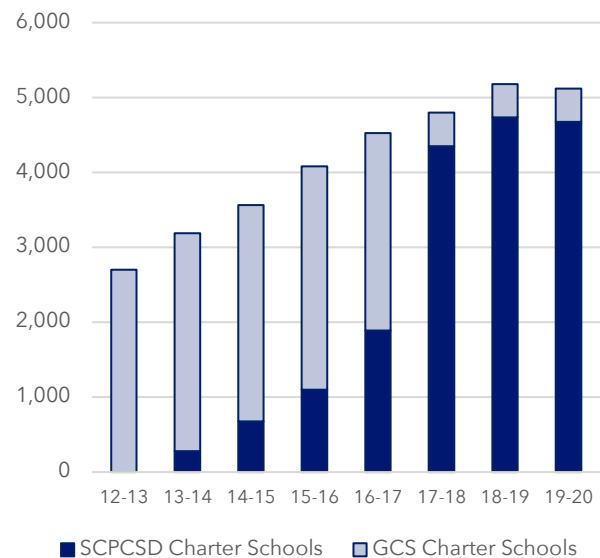
For the most part charter schools in the state do not receive public funding for facilities. However, state and federal low-cost loan programs have been utilized by some charters.

As shown in Chart 1, enrollment in charter schools in Greenville County steadily increased through 2018-19 as new schools were initiated and existing schools added grades. One charter school closed before the start of the 2019-20 school year. The chart also shows the migration of charter schools from under the auspices of Greenville County Schools to oversight by the South Carolina Public Charter School District. Financial aspects of the switch were a significant consideration in this change.

In 2019-20 a total of 5,120 students were enrolled in charter schools in Greenville County. Of this number, 450 (9%) attended the one charter school under Greenville County Schools while 4,670 (91%) attended the nine charter schools overseen by the South Carolina Public Charter School District.

GCS: Greenville County Schools

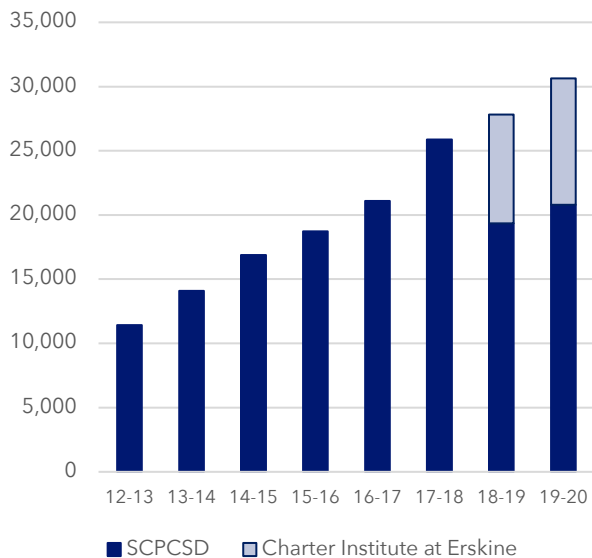

South Carolina Charter Schools

A large number of charter schools in South Carolina operate under two statewide districts: the South Carolina Public Charter School District—a statewide school district established by the state legislature—and the Charter Institute at Erskine. As Chart 2 shows, combined enrollment in these two school districts continues to grow totalling more than 30,630 students in 2019-20 (20,785 in SCPCSD and 9,845 in Erskine). Some of the increase was due to the migration of charter schools from local school districts to statewide charter school districts.
