HOW DO WE PAY OUR TEACHERS?

State Minimum Teacher Salaries

Minimum salaries for teachers are set by the state and are based upon education level and number of years of teaching experience. Minimum salary increases are also set by the state: annual increases (step increases) for each additional year of teaching experience and increases for completion of an advanced degree. Salaries are composed of two parts: the base amount and the Education Improvement Act (EIA) salary supplement. The total salary is the sum of these two amounts.

The [state minimum salary schedule](#) goes up to 23 years of teaching experience. Under the state budget continuing resolution for FY2020-21, the state salary schedule currently remains the same as the previous year.

Table 1 compares South Carolina's state minimum salaries with those of other southeast states for 2019-20. It shows that South Carolina ranks 6th out of 9 Southeast states for the minimum salary for a first-year teacher with a bachelor's degree. It ranks 5th out of 9 Southeast states for a teacher with ten years of experience and a bachelor's degree. Table 2 compares 2018-19 state average salaries for Southeast states. In this comparison South Carolina ranks 8th out of 12 states and is below the combined average of the other 11 states.

Greenville County Schools Teacher Salaries

Like most other school districts, our district pays teachers above the state minimums to try to keep teacher pay competitive with area school districts—both in-state and out-of-state. The salaries in [Greenville County Schools' teacher salary schedule](#) are made up of three parts: the state base amount and EIA supplement plus a local supplement.

Due to the state budget continuing resolution, the FY2020-21 salary schedule for the district is the same as the previous year's but now covers up to 32 years of teaching experience. For teachers with experience beyond the salary schedule, it has been the practice of the school district, as approved by the Board of Trustees, to give these teachers salary increases whenever step increases are given to those within the salary schedule.

Table 2 on this page and the two on the next include Greenville County Schools' salaries in their comparisons. Table 3 ranks its salaries for various levels of teaching experience and professional education among the 79 regular school districts in the state. Table 4 compares Greenville County School salaries against those of school districts in metropolitan areas that the Greenville Chamber of Commerce considers "target" metros. National Board Certification Supplement

State fiscal year 2017-18 was the final year for teachers to apply for National Board certification and be eligible to receive an annual salary supplement from the state upon achieving certification. Teachers with existing certification will continue to receive the supplement for the remaining time of their certificate.

Those who entered the program prior to July 1, 2010 will continue to receive an annual salary supplement from the state of \$7,500 for the remaining period of their certification. Those who initially applied to the

program after that date will continue to receive an annual salary supplement of \$5,000 for the remaining time of their certificate.

Loan Forgiveness Programs and other Financial Incentives

Salary supplements provided by some school districts in the state include signing bonuses and stipends for teacher mentors.

At the state level the SC Teachers Loan Program provides for loan forgiveness for teaching in a critical subject or critical geographic area. A loan is forgiven at the rate of 20% or \$3,000, whichever is greater, for each full year of teaching in a South Carolina public school in a critical subject or critical geographic area. For those teaching in both a critical subject and a critical geographic area, their loan is forgiven at the rate of 33 1/3% or \$5,000, whichever is greater, for each year of full-time teaching. (*South Carolina Student Loan, Teacher Loan Program*)

Additionally, the Rural Teacher Recruitment Incentive program is offered to school districts with an average teacher turnover rate above 11% for the last five years and which are not among the fifteen wealthiest schools districts in the state. Funded by the state and administered by the Center for Educator Recruitment, Retention & Advancement, this program provides various financial incentives for teaching in an eligible school district. This includes specific student loan forgiveness opportunities beyond what is available in the SC Teachers Loan Program as well as salary supplements for teacher mentors. Other types of incentives are possible. (*2019-20 South Carolina state appropriations bill, proviso 1A.54*)

All thirty-six eligible school districts participated in the Rural Teacher Recruitment Incentive program in 2018-19. Twenty-eight of these reported fewer teachers leaving and/or fewer vacant teaching positions compared to the previous year. In 2019-20 thirty-five districts were eligible for the program. (*"South Carolina Annual Educator Supply & Demand Report," Center for Educator Recruitment, Retention & Advancement (CERRA), December 2019*)

Teacher Salaries for Those Receiving Retirement Benefits

A change in the allowed salary for teachers receiving retirement benefits occurred in 2018. Initiated in 2000 to keep experienced teachers in the classroom, the South Carolina Teacher and Employee Retirement Incentive (TERI) program allowed teachers to keep their salary and work up to five years after they officially retire during which time their pension benefits were banked in a special account. They then received a lump sum payment of the accrued benefit amounts at the end of their program participation. Effective July 1, 2012 the program was closed to new hires, and new enrollees in the program after that date were required to end their participation within five years or by June 30, 2018, whichever was earlier.

With the end of TERI, under current state law, annual salaries for teachers receiving retirement benefits are capped at \$10,000 except for those teaching a critical need subject and/or teaching at a critical need school. There is a waiver in place for these teachers.
